From the Principal



Dear WLPS Community,

I just love the Edu-dance concerts! What a fantastic demonstration of the children's ability to memorise a sequence of movements, focus on a rhythm, demonstrate their fitness and their confidence. Yesterday's concert was fantastic and I'm looking forward to another great show on Monday.

Tomorrow, students will bring home their semester one formal reports. These reports are so everyone has a clear picture of their child's current achievements and the progress they have made. Every student report from pre-primary to year two contains a scale from 'Very Low' to 'Excellent'; and from years three to year seven an A-E scale; to ensure reporting against common state-wide standards. This means that the ratings your child receives in their report have the same meaning at every school across the state.

The achievement standards refer to what a child should typically be able to do by the end of the year, at each year level. Each achievement standard provides the key reference point for reporting on student achievement, including the appropriate scale referred to above. When student achievement is reported mid-year, students will be making progress toward the expected achievement standard. In the middle of the year teachers make an on-balance judgement as to what level of achievement the student is demonstrating in relation to the standard, taking into account the curriculum taught and assessed to that point in the year.

Your child's report will have clearly written comments that tell you what your child knows and what they can do. The report may also identify areas in which your child needs further help or can improve, and some recommendations for your child's future learning. Please read the report with your child. Praise them for their achievement and discuss personal goals that they could set for second semester. If you have any concerns please do not hesitate to make a time to meet with your child's teacher.

Last Friday night I had the good fortune to attend the annual P&C quiz night with a table of my colleagues and a room full of outrageously dressed parents. It was a great night, with lots of laughs and many very tricky questions. There were some incredible prizes to be won, and items to be bought at auction, and although I have not heard what the final funds raised figure is, I'd be surprised if it was not a record breaker. An enormous thank you to the organising committee and to all the very generous members of our wider community.

After school Robotics club

A parent within our school community will be running a pilot program after school during Term 3 in Robotics for students in years 4,5 & 6. This 10 week programme will teach students to design, program, and control fully-functional models using **LEGO®**

MINDSTORMS® components. They will use software to plan, test, and modify sequences of instructions for a variety of life-like robotic behaviours. Students will learn to collect and analyse data from sensors, using data logging functionalities embedded in the software. Curriculum lessons are developed from Lego Education and Carnegie Mellon University's Robotics Academy and provide a series of real-life activities, covering topics within science, technology, engineering, and mathematics. All equipment will be supplied, and an instructor and assistant will be on hand to work with the students.

The course is designed to be a fun after school activity while meeting some important STEM educational needs.

The program will be held at WLPS library once a week from 3:15 – 5PM with the day to be either Monday or Tuesday (possibly both, subject to take up) and a maximum of 16 places available per course. The cost of the 10 week programme is \$150.
