2018 Booklists

Next week, all students intending to return to WLPS to continue their education in 2018 will be issued with a list of stationery requirements. These 'booklists' will also be available on our website. As a convenience to busy parents, our preferred supplier Campion has an online ordering system which is an easy way to have all of your school resources delivered to the nominated address, with free delivery if ordered before Friday, 20th October. Thereafter, a delivery fee will apply for orders placed online.

Parents placing orders online with Campion also have the convenience of paying for the voluntary school fees and the school diary at the same time. Although parents are welcome to purchase these items at any retail outlet of their choice, to ensure that the specific publications listed are able to be sourced in time for the commencement of school in 2018, we would encourage parents not to wait until next year to purchase them. To ensure a smooth start to learning in the 2018 school year, it is imperative that students bring all of the items on the school requirements list for the first day of school.

Uniforms

School dress requirements play an important role in promoting a positive image of the school and create a sense of identity among students.

It is expected that students at West Leederville Primary School will wear the school uniform as endorsed by the School Board.

This dress code applies for pre-primary students to Year 6. The uniform meets the guidelines of Sun Smart policies and is designed to be attractive and comfortable. The uniform details are available on our Uniform Policy which can be accessed at any time through our website: Uniform Policy.

Parents are asked to check 'lost property' for missing items, in particular outer garments and to take advantage of the free 'smart tags' system. Once sewn into the garment, the parents will have an sms message sent to their phone alerting them if it appears in the lost property.

It is expected that lost items will be replaced to ensure that students abide by the Uniform Policy.
