Please make every effort to attend these meetings. If you have further queries please do not hesitate to make a time to see the classroom teacher individually, or one of the Leadership team (myself, Michael McInerheney, Lisa Wade or Shelley Hollett) if your concern cannot be resolved.

School Board

The first Board meeting of the year was held on Tuesday night. Each year at this meeting a Board Chair for the year is elected. House Keeping

After School Play

The parents and children of West Leederville PS are most welcome to stay at school, after school to play and socialise. However, it is important that the rules the children abide by during the school day (such as not playing in the toilets or climbing the big tree) are followed out of hours as well. These rules are in place for the health and safety of all. Parents, please ensure you supervise your own children at this time and that you encourage them to be respectful of their school environment.

The Hall

The hall in the heritage building is regularly used as a teaching space. The teachers using this area are finding that parents arriving early for pick up are causing a distraction to the learning program being taught. We request that all parents please wait outside the building until after the siren has sounded.

Kiss and Drive

Thank you to all of the drivers who are using this area safely. If you are new to this facility please have a read the procedures outlined below to ensure you are following the same rules as everyone else and keeping our children safe.

Driving and parking safely near schools

- School opening and closing hours are busy times for pedestrians and vehicles outside the school.
- · Always take extra care in 40km/h school zones, which operate on gazetted school days.
- Park safely, even if it means walking further to the school gate.
- Observe all parking signs. They are planned with children's safety in mind.
- · Never double park as it puts children at risk.
- Model safe and considerate behaviour for your child they will learn from you.
- · Slow down near the school crossing.
- At a supervised crossing, observe the directions of the school crossing supervisor.
- Always park and turn legally around the school.
- Avoid dangerous manoeuvres such as U-turns and three-point turns.
- · Always give way to pedestrians, particularly when entering and leaving driveways.
- Avoid parking across the school driveway or the entrance to the school car park.
- Using your school's drop off and pick up facility will help keep all children as safe as possible during the busiest times of the school day.
- Avoid parking in or near the school bus bay.

Swimming Squad

The 2018 swimming squad commences again this Friday, 9th February. Mrs Chadwick, with the support of Sally & Poppy Gilfillan, who are experienced swimming coaches, run this squad for students in Years 4 to 6 who are at level 8 or above. This is a swimming squad for children with strong swimming skills who are keen to represent the school at the interschool carnival.

The Big Splash

WLPS is one of a limited number of schools who elected to be involved in the Big Splash WA Schools Program this year and we are well on the way to having our amazing school dolphin 'Westie', ready to join the other dolphins in the BIG SPLASH pod at the Perth Convention Centre on the weekend of the 17th and 18th of March. The Big Splash WA Schools Program has been developed in response to the alarming increase in the number of children and young people presenting to Emergency Departments with self-harm and attempted suicide – a 400% increase in the last five years. The program helps teachers and parents navigate the topic of mental health and wellbeing with their students and children. With a focus on building resilience, the program teaches children to recognise their emotions and develop essential coping strategies.

The chosen design for WLPS 'Westie' is a compilation of student ideas generated from the school wide competition. All students from PP to Year 6 will have their finger print placed on the dolphin, so it will truly encapsulate the West Leederville spirit. We will have a special unveiling assembly towards the end of the month.

The Big Splash WA Art Trail launched on 20th January with 36 unique dolphin sculptures popping up around the Perth CBD. It will be a wonderful opportunity for family outings so spread the word and come along. The Art Trail is a fun, engaging and positive event that will spark lots of conversations about mental health wellbeing to remind all children that they can speak about their feelings; they are not alone and real help is available.
