Question and Answer

What time are students allowed to arrive at school?

Students should not arrive at school before 8.30am. If students are on the school grounds they must be supervised by their parent or caregiver. Classrooms are opened at 8.35am to allow students time to prepare for the day. Before school care is available on site through Camp Australia.

Can my child wear their faction shirt on photo day?

Please have all children in their full blue school uniform for school photo days on the 20th, 21st and 23rd March. If they have sport on these days they may bring their faction shirt in their school bag and change for PE.

What is the P&C movie night fundraising for?

So many things! Each year the P&C contributes money to each learning area for the purchase of items such as reading books, hands-on maths equipment, art materials, musical instruments, puzzles for the little kids, sports equipment, the list goes on. They also contribute to 'big ticket' items such as playground equipment, shade, pa systems, and anything that makes your child's school experience as good as it can possibly be.

What do we do regarding school if we take our children travelling for a few months?

The Education Act says:

- 1. Enrol them in the School of Isolated and Distance Education children do school work online with an assigned tutor. The student must be travelling overseas for a minimum of one school semester or twenty school weeks. (Proof: airline ticket and itinerary). The students should not have access to an English speaking school.
- 2. Register yourself with the WA Department of Education as a Home Educator. You will have to demonstrate to the Department of Education that you are fulfilling the requirements of the WA curriculum.
- 3. Enrol them at a school abroad.
- 4. They miss school and are recorded on the role as 'unauthorised absence' or 'unauthorised vacation'. The school is not required to provide work. We would suggest continuing with Reading Eggs, Mathletics and any other classwork or assignments the teacher may choose to provide. It is also a good idea to keep a travel diary and to communicate with the class via email or postcard.

Construction will take place along the western side of the Woolwich Street and Northwood Street roundabout. The whole of Woolwich Street at this intersection will be closed. Northwood Street will remain unaffected travelling north and south bound and east into Woolwich. Detours and traffic management will be in place. A Visit to Kaarta Koomba (Kings Park)

Last week the Year 4 students travelled to King's Park to learn about the fascinating history and cultural significance of Kaarta Koomba (Kings Park). The students discussed the first European explorers to the Swan River Colony and considered how Perth has changed over time from its first people and tradition custodians, the Wadjuk Nyoongar people, to present day. Through an interactive walk through the WA Botanic Garden, the students learnt how the Wadjuk Nyoongar people were guided by the six seasons and used plants and animals for food, shelter, tools and medicine. The students created a journey stick to remind them all they had learnt about the uses of plants and animals.

Incorporating the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander histories and cultures into learning areas and ensuring that Aboriginal histories, languages and cultures are respected and valued by all students, ties directly into the <u>Aboriginal Cultural Standards Framework</u> which is identified as a priority in the Department of Education's Strategic Plan for WA Public Schools 2016-2019 and Focus 2018. Further excursions for different year groups have also been planned to participate in similar excursions.

The Year 4 students thoroughly enjoyed their experience and finished the afternoon exploring nature in the Naturescape park.

At the conclusion of the two weeks of swimming lessons, the students will be presented with certificates to show the skills they have successfully demonstrated.

Commencing on 12th March the students from Years 5 and 6 will travel to Bold Park Aquatic Centre to participate in their interm swimming program. The students from Pre-primary to Year 2 will have their interm swimming lessons late in Term 4.
