The competition gives girls and boys the opportunity to play four action packed games of cricket in an active and social setting - all on the one day in a gala day format. NAPLAN online trials

West Leederville Primary School is a pilot school for NAPLAN online. This means we are one of 277 schools in the state 'getting in first' and receiving all of the additional support that goes with being a pilot school. This will ensure that we have the appropriate infrastructure and technology to allow our children to do their best in this new testing environment. This week, all students in Years 3 and 5 have participated in a series of practice tests. The main purpose of these tests is to ensure our network has the capability to cope with the number of students we require to be online at the same time. However, it also gives our students valuable experience with the style of question and response formats that will be in the NAPLAN assessments they will be taking between May 8th and 11th next term.

Learning about money



The Money Smart incursion left a big impression on Felicia and Oscar from the Kindergarten Blue class.

Last week, students from K - 6 participated in a financial literacy program called Start Smart.

The early childhood students were paid a visit from Captain Cash who taught them about notes and coins, Australian currency, keeping money safe, the difference between needs and wants and using money for goods and services.

Our middle primary classes met Coach Cash who cover concepts such as credit cards and keycards, earning money, spending habits, comparative shopping, maximising savings, solving problems involving purchases and budgeting.

Senior students discussed topics such as goal setting, earning money, savings strategies, interest, banks and developing confidence in managing their financial futures.
