School Contributions and Charges 2023

The School Contributions and Charges booklet helps parents and carers understand the school fee structure and determine the estimated total cost of their child's education.

The costs outlined are maximums that the school will not exceed. Actual costs for most parents will be below these figures.

The West Leederville Primary School Board has endorsed this schedule.



2023 School Costs

There are six areas to consider:

1. VOLUNTARY CONTRIBUTIONS

The Western Australian Government's priority is to ensure that all students are able to access an education program that satisfies the requirements of the Western Australian Curriculum, within the prescribed maximum contribution of \$60 for students enrolled in Kindergarten to Year 6. While the contributions are voluntary, the quality of our teaching and learning program will be maximised when all families contribute. Your contribution will be used to supplement school funding for the purchase of resources needed in the provision of the learning program activities. The following tables show the approximate distribution of funds raised from voluntary contributions.

2. STUDENT PERSONAL ITEMS (Booklist)

The Student Personal Item list covers consumable items for use in lessons such as stationery items, work books and calculator. You are welcome to purchase these items at any retail outlet of your choice; however, we do offer the convenience of pre-ordering and home delivery through our chosen supplier. 1:1 IPAD PROGRAM-YEAR 4 TO 6

A 1:1 iPad program commences in Year 4 at West Leederville Primary School. It is anticipated that each student device will cost from approximately \$500 and students will be required to purchase up to \$40 of apps across the three year program. Participation in this program is voluntary, however strongly encouraged.

3. DIGITAL TECHNOLOGY VOLUNTARY CONTRIBUTION

This cost assists with the provision of digital technology resources for students from Pre-primary to Year 6.
